GREEN PROCUREMENT GUIDELINES

Keppel is committed to building a resilient, responsible, and diversified supply chain, including through integrating sustainability criteria in the selection, monitoring and assessment of suppliers. Through proactive engagement, we encourage our partners to adopt responsible practices which minimise negative impacts and contribute to sustainable development.

These guidelines are to support Keppel's commitment to environmental stewardship and resource efficiency. It is a structured approach to integrate environmental considerations into procurement decisions, ensuring that sustainability is deeply integrated across the supply chain.

The following guiding principles are to be considered in the selection of Suppliers:

1. Supplier Certifications

Preference shall be given, where relevant, to suppliers with accredited environmental and occupational health & safety management systems, such as ISO140001 and ISO45001 or their equivalent.

2. Energy Efficiency and Emission Reduction

Priority will be placed on products, equipment and services which demonstrate energy efficiency and reduced greenhouse gas emissions throughout their lifecycle. Suppliers can demonstrate the sustainable credentials of their products through Environmental Product Declarations, obtaining certifications such as Singapore's BCA Green Mark Certification (for buildings) or equivalent certifications applicable in non-Singapore markets, or offering supplier take-back schemes.

3. Resource Efficiency, Waste Reduction and Pollution Control

Preference shall be given to suppliers who can supply products with lower resource consumption, that utilize minimal or recyclable packaging and reduce pollution or waste generation.

4. Alignment with National Standards

Keppel's Singapore-based entities should, where relevant, adopt the Singapore Government's Green Procurement Requirements. This includes reference to the National Environment Agency's (NEA) Mandatory Energy Labelling Scheme (MELS) for relevant electrical appliances and lighting, the latest ENERGY STAR standards for ICT equipment (where available), and the Singapore Green Labelling Scheme for printing paper. Non-Singapore entities should adopt the equivalent local standards, where available.
